Prefacio

En diciembre de 2020 a los 78 años murió en la Ciudad de México José Adolfo Rodríguez Gallardo, primer investigador emérito adscrito al Centro Universitario de Investigaciones Bibliotecológicas (CUIB) hoy Instituto de Investigaciones Bibliotecológicas y de la Información (IIBI) de la UNAM. Meses antes de su deceso le fueron publicados los libros *Ética bibliotecaria: entre la tradición, la tecnología y la educación* (2019), *Alfabetización, lectura y sociedad: una mirada desde la historia* (2020), y *Libertad de imprenta en Hispanoamérica: religión, ciudadanía y educación* (2020).

Al mismo tiempo en que trabajó las obras mencionadas, desarrollaba el proyecto “El uso de los instrumentos tecnológicos en las bibliotecas, 1876-2000”, con el objetivo de identificar las tecnologías que se incorporaron al trabajo bibliotecario para, posteriormente, describir cómo influyeron en la labor y el servicio bibliotecario. Uno de los productos de esta investigación habría de ser una obra monográfica en dos volúmenes que llevaría por título *Catálogo de los instrumentos tecnológicos anunciados en Library Journal que se usaron en las bibliotecas*.

Es posible que la idea de esta investigación haya surgido a principios del año 2000, derivada de su trabajo sobre la formación humanística del bibliotecario con la que obtuvo el grado de doctor

en pedagogía en 1998 y en la que analizó la formación del bibliotecario profesional en México. Por siempre, dentro de los temas de su interés estuvo la formación del bibliotecario, entre otros aspectos, su pérdida de identidad. Sin embargo, en ese período se dedicó al estudio de la brecha digital y el *Open Access*.

Hacia 2013, en el seminario “Tecnologías de la Información y Sociedad” que impartió como parte del Programa de Maestría en Bibliotecología y Estudios de la Información de la UNAM retomó la idea. Se dio a la tarea de identificar las publicaciones periódicas que podría emplear en el estudio, algunas de las analizadas fueron *Library Journal* (1876), *Medical Libraries* (1898), y *Bulletin of the American Library Association* (1907).

Como se advierte, centró su atención en varias de las primeras publicaciones sobre la disciplina, aunque sólo de origen estadounidense. No obstante, en esa época trabajaba en el proyecto “José Vasconcelos: pensamiento y acción” que concluiría con la publicación de *José Vasconcelos: alfabetización, bibliotecas, lectura y edición* (2015). Así que no fue sino hasta 2018 en que la idea se formalizó; fortalecer la identidad del bibliotecario y el papel social de la biblioteca y la bibliotecología, especialmente entre las nuevas generaciones, fueron algunas de las razones que sin lugar a duda le motivaron.

Al iniciar esta investigación pretendía traer a discusión, entre otros temas, la idea que asumen algunos bibliotecarios respecto de que las nuevas tecnologías pueden resolver todos los problemas y retos que encara la biblioteca. Poseedor de una extensa práctica profesional, 26 años al frente de la Dirección General de Bibliotecas (DGB) hoy Dirección General de Bibliotecas y Servicios Digitales de Información (DGBSDI) de la UNAM, jamás desestimó la utilidad e importancia de los instrumentos tecnológicos que han permitido a las bibliotecas prestar más y mejores servicios, su aspiración era provocar una reflexión en relación con que las tecnologías por sí solas no innovan ni garantizan la calidad en el servicio que brindan las bibliotecas.

Para el desarrollo de este proyecto recurrió al método de investigación documental, determinó como fuente de información primaria al *Library Journal*, la primera revista especializada, en la que habría de identificar y analizar los anuncios comerciales publicados desde el nacimiento de aquella en 1876 hasta el año 2000. A través de los anuncios comerciales, que consideró testimonios de los objetos, pretendía analizar las tecnologías disponibles, representar las tendencias y documentar su inclusión en las bibliotecas, así como sus efectos en el servicio que éstas prestaban.

En su primer aniversario luctuoso el IIBI ha decidido publicar el *Catálogo de los instrumentos tecnológicos anunciados en Library Journal que se usaron en las bibliotecas*, como muestra de respeto y reconocimiento por su labor y contribución a la bibliotecología mexicana y latinoamericana. Así, la obra que el lector tiene en sus manos, reproduce el trabajo tal como fue conceptualizado; sin embargo, debido a que es una obra inconclusa, conviene advertir sobre algunas de sus características.

En esta obra, las imágenes de los anuncios publicados originalmente, en orden cronológico para brindar una línea de tiempo, acompañados de una breve reseña y su referencia hemerográfica para fines de localización y verificación, constituyen el cuerpo del trabajo. Con relación a las referencias debe decirse que, dado que todas ellas se obtuvieron del *Library Journal*, en su estructura y sólo por fines de brevedad, el título de la revista aparece como *LJ*. La obra se ha dividido en dos volúmenes, cada uno de ellos dispuestos de la siguiente manera.

El volumen 1, *De 1876 a 1950*. Seccionado por períodos de 25 años, consta de tres capítulos: 1876-1900, 1901-1925, 1926-1950. Cada uno de ellos está acompañado por una introducción escrita por el autor, una bibliografía y al final del volumen un índice analítico. Se trata de una versión preliminar que fue trabajada íntegramente por el autor, quien decidió no insertar los anuncios de todos los años: en el capítulo 1876-1900 se excluyeron los

correspondientes a seis años; en el capítulo 1901-1925 seis años también; y en el capítulo 1926-1950 dos.

Volumen 2, *De 1951 a 1991*. Consta de dos capítulos, 1951-1975 y 1976-1991. Es preciso indicar que este volumen representa un documento de trabajo que se integra de una selección de los anuncios comerciales acompañados por su reseña, referencia y al final un índice analítico; elementos que serían nuevamente revisados y purgados por el autor. Cabe destacar que el título original para el segundo volumen sería *De 1951 a 2000*, ya que de acuerdo con el plan de trabajo se incorporarían los anuncios publicados hasta ese año. Sin embargo, el autor no tuvo acceso al *Library Journal* impreso correspondiente a 1992-2000, entre otras razones debido a la declaración de emergencia por COVID-19 en marzo de 2020. Por otra parte, tampoco incluyó anuncios publicados en 1976.

A pesar de que el proyecto abarcaba los primeros 125 años del *Library Journal* el autor sólo pudo revisar y analizar 116; como producto de esta actividad compiló 1 458 anuncios comerciales, pero no todos ellos fueron incluidos en esta obra. Existe una diferencia significativa entre la cantidad de anuncios que integran el volumen 1 y el 2 debido a que el último estaba en proceso de depuración.

Las reseñas de los productos son extractos tomados de los textos que forman parte de los anuncios, y como se menciona en la introducción, éstos pueden o no presentar la descripción del producto, y cuando la incluyen lo hacen con mayor o menor detalle. En la búsqueda de los anuncios trabajó los directorios de proveedores, las secciones de tecnología y los números especiales del *Library Journal*. Si bien descartó los directorios (“Directory of Library Supplies” y “Classified Directory of Library Supplies”) seleccionó provisionalmente tecnologías incluidas en la sección “New buildings and equipment”, de la misma forma en que eligió anuncios publicados en números especiales, por ejemplo, en *Children’s & Young People’s Libraries* y *Library Computing*.

La extensión del trabajo originó la necesidad de elaborar índices analíticos. Si bien el autor consideró la conveniencia de agrupar los productos publicitados de acuerdo con las áreas de la biblioteca, por ejemplo: servicios al público, procesos técnicos, y administración; pronto fue evidente que algunos de ellos podían ser empleados en más de un área, así como la necesidad de contemplar aspectos específicos. En consecuencia, los índices analíticos están desagregados por áreas de actividad, aplicación, proveedor y producto.

Para quienes vimos gestarse el proyecto y su producto no cabe duda de la paciencia, cuidado y entusiasmo con los que el doctor Adolfo Rodríguez trabajó en este libro. Del mismo modo, el interés del IIBI en su publicación representa un profundo compromiso con su investigador y la propagación de sus ideas. En esta obra, se vislumbra la actitud característica de Adolfo Rodríguez, quien en la introducción a este su libro escribió: “Para concluir, me ha parecido encontrar una mina de oro de información al revisar estos casi 125 años de la revista *Library Journal*”.

Presentación

La tecnología ha irrumpido en la biblioteca al grado de constituirse en un área de estudio para la Bibliotecología y los Estudios de la Información que pretende entender “sus efectos, problemas y soluciones en bibliotecas, archivos, colecciones, servicios, usuarios y publicaciones en la sociedad actual”.¹

Si bien es cierto que en la actualidad el enfoque predominante son las Tecnologías de la Información y Comunicación (TIC), también lo es que durante toda su existencia la biblioteca se ha beneficiado de tecnologías diversas. Díaz-Calderín señala: “Tecnología no es solo la computadora, sino todos aquellos instrumentos y la forma y uso que se le dé en beneficio de una situación para solucionar un problema con una perspectiva de avance”.²

A partir de lo anterior, la tecnología se define como la aplicación del conocimiento científico a los fines prácticos de la vida humana y es obvio que en el trabajo bibliotecario se han aplicado diversas tecnologías. Además de aquellas relacionadas con la comunicación, entre las que se encuentran la imprenta, las telecomunicaciones, el

procesamiento de la información y la ciencia de la computación, espectaculares por su impacto, se ha recurrido a otras que, a pesar de ser modestas, han ayudado a resolver los problemas cotidianos.

Sin embargo, se ha realizado poca investigación en cuanto a examinar las consecuencias del uso de la tecnología para el bibliotecario, la biblioteca y el usuario de la misma. Un estudio histórico sobre la tecnología en la biblioteca que privilegie la crítica informada y reflexiva, con un enfoque humanista, permitirá mantener la identidad de la biblioteca y de los bibliotecarios. Mediante este autoconocimiento la comunidad bibliotecaria podrá potenciar su desempeño, compartir costumbres, tradiciones, formas de pensamiento y acción. Así entendería el presente y se preparará para el futuro sin perder identidad.

Este trabajo pretende identificar los instrumentos tecnológicos que se incorporaron al trabajo bibliotecario de 1876 a 2000,³ para en un futuro describir cómo influyeron en la labor y el servicio bibliotecario.

La implementación de las herramientas tecnológicas en las bibliotecas ha contribuido a cambiar el panorama de éstas; los bibliotecarios, y en general el personal de las bibliotecas, han experimentado cambios en la manera en que desempeñan las actividades de adquisición, organización, recuperación y provisión de acceso a las colecciones en razón del uso de tecnología. Incluso la tecnología más sencilla que se haya implementado representó en su tiempo una mejora sustancial en la calidad del servicio, la organización de las colecciones y la conservación de las mismas.

Sobre la base de una investigación documental en la que se identificaron los anuncios comerciales publicados en *Library Journal* de 1876-2000 se describen las herramientas tecnológicas disponibles en el mercado durante el período señalado. El trabajo

se plantea de tal forma en virtud de que no todas las bibliotecas implementaron esas herramientas a causa de diversos motivos, entre ellos los de índole económica.

Se seleccionó el *Library Journal* por ser la publicación más representativa de la bibliotecología norteamericana. Fundada en 1876 por Melvin Dewey, incluye información sobre materiales y equipos relacionados con las bibliotecas; si bien hace hincapié en bibliotecas públicas, los materiales y equipos no son de su exclusividad. Adicionalmente, al ser la revista especializada de mayor circulación es altamente probable que la difusión de los instrumentos tecnológicos que se pretenden estudiar haya llegado a un número importante de bibliotecas, incluyendo las mexicanas.

Este trabajo requirió de la selección de anuncios con la que se eliminó la duplicidad, así como la compilación y categorización de los hallazgos. No se limita a la descripción de la tecnología, sino que muestra la forma en la que se promocionaba la misma.

Introducción

En 1876 se celebró el primer centenario de la independencia de los Estados Unidos y en el mundo bibliotecario estadounidense ocurrieron dos acontecimientos de gran importancia: la creación de la American Library Association (ALA); y la publicación del *Library Journal*.

La revista fue dirigida inicialmente por su fundador, y pilar del desarrollo bibliotecario norteamericano, Melvil Dewey. Personaje que, además de instaurar la primera escuela de bibliotecarios en los Estados Unidos y crear el sistema de clasificación decimal que es conocido por su nombre, fue el primer presidente de la ALA.

El *Library Journal*, órgano de difusión de la ALA, se convertiría en poco tiempo en el medio por el que los profesionales de la bibliotecología compartirían sus preocupaciones sobre los problemas relacionados con el servicio bibliotecario. A través de él se abordaron temas como la educación bibliotecológica y la bibliotecología comparada, pues los bibliotecarios que viajaban al extranjero tenían el cuidado de publicar sus impresiones sobre el acontecer bibliotecario de los países visitados. De igual forma, se trataban problemas que surgían en la esfera nacional y mundial; se tocó en detalle la construcción de bibliotecas de todo tipo y desde varios puntos de vista: el arquitectónico, el de servicio y el de diseño de espacios.

Por la naturaleza de la publicación ésta reseñaba el desarrollo de los servicios, de los métodos, e instrumentos, al tiempo que se probaban e implementaban en las bibliotecas. Los bibliotecarios estadounidenses encontraban en el *Library Journal* un referente para su trabajo. Labor que había tenido como objetivos principales el acopio de colecciones y la conservación de las mismas, y que apenas en el siglo XIX enfatizaría el servicio a la comunidad.

En su largo camino, bibliotecas y bibliotecarios experimentaron cambios que modificaron los métodos de trabajo pero no la esencia de éste. Por ejemplo, las bibliotecas pasaron del acopio de tabletas de arcilla, a incorporar papiro y posteriormente papel; de acuerdo con su forma integraron materiales que se producían en forma de rollo, de libro (códex), periódicos y hojas sueltas, entre otros, que dieron una nueva característica a la biblioteca. Cambió la forma de acceder a los materiales, se pasó de los libros en estantes completamente cerrados a los libros encadenados, éstos aunque de acceso limitado representaron para los lectores la posibilidad de tenerlos al alcance directo, sin intervención del bibliotecario, para posteriormente permitir el acceso libre y sin restricción a la estantería.

Se adoptaron diferentes métodos, rutinas, e instrumentos para el servicio bibliotecario; sin embargo, la idea de que la biblioteca y los bibliotecarios se encuentran anclados en los viejos principios de la conservación y que son resistentes al cambio es el motivo de este trabajo. Por años los grupos que utilizan la tecnología de la información y el público en general han visto a la biblioteca y a los bibliotecarios como un refugio de conservadores que se oponen sistemáticamente al avance tecnológico. Este estereotipo produjo que en los años finales del siglo pasado, y aun en los primeros de éste, se diga que los bibliotecarios y las bibliotecas son reductos de tradiciones que de una forma u otra se resisten a cambiar.

Al afirmar lo anterior, se olvida que la biblioteca fue la primera que abrió sus puertas para que los usuarios consultaran libremente los materiales documentales, que incluyó todo tipo de éstos y que,

como se muestra en este trabajo, incorporó distintas tecnologías a las actividades diarias y a los servicios que proporciona a los usuarios.

Para tener una mejor idea de las transformaciones del trabajo bibliotecario se han identificado los instrumentos tecnológicos publicados en forma de anuncios comerciales en *Library Journal*, que a la fecha tiene casi 150 años de publicación ininterrumpida.

Es necesario señalar que los anuncios comerciales que aquí se incluyen no están relacionados con libros, publicaciones periódicas, mapas o cualquier otro material bibliográfico, sino que comprenden productos que empezaron a ser utilizados en las bibliotecas. Éstos son de carácter diverso, desde artículos de papelería, materiales para encuadernación, mobiliario, utensilios para marcar las colecciones, guillotinas para papel, selladores, hasta máquinas de escribir e instrumentos electrónicos que han permitido preservar los materiales, almacenarlos y difundirlos de manera más eficiente que las formas empleadas hasta ese momento.

Los instrumentos se presentan en orden cronológico con relación a su primera fecha de publicación aunque reaparezcan con posterioridad; pero cuando muestran cambios se insertan nuevamente. Si bien algunos productos no cuentan con las cualidades que permitan describirlos como una tecnología específica, son considerados si es que, sin lugar a duda, representan un avance que permite realizar el trabajo de la biblioteca con mayor facilidad y eficiencia. También fue posible observar que se daba noticia de productos semejantes los cuales, por fines de brevedad, fueron desestimados.

Se ha elegido la presentación cronológica porque permite observar y evaluar qué materiales y utensilios se fueron incorporando al trabajo bibliotecario de manera secuencial. Los anuncios comerciales incluyen sus datos hemerográficos con el fin de facilitar su localización, si el lector desea ampliar la información o corroborar la presentada en este trabajo.

En el *Library Journal*, además de los anuncios comerciales, se publicaron secciones específicas que hacían referencia a productos y/o servicios para las bibliotecas, entre ellas: “Directory of Library Supplies”, “Classified Directory of Library Supplies” y “New Buildings and Equipment”. En función de lo anterior, queda abierta la posibilidad de hacer un estudio más detallado investigando el texto de la revista, pues en algunos casos, en las notas que se proporcionan sobre una biblioteca o en los artículos, hay información relacionada con el uso de algún instrumento tecnológico que no había sido anunciado previamente, ni lo sería posteriormente.

Los anuncios son de diferente tipo: unos tienen información gráfica, la descripción del producto, y su utilidad; otros, información parcial y en ocasiones sólo incluyen frases que buscan atraer la atención e interés del lector; por último, están los que tienen una imagen o unas cuantas líneas con el nombre del producto sin información adicional que permita un comentario sobre el mismo.

Por la amplitud de este trabajo ha sido necesario dividirlo en dos volúmenes. El primero comprende los anuncios publicados de 1876, año en que inicia la publicación del *Library Journal*, hasta 1950. El segundo volumen incluye los anuncios que aparecieron de 1951 a 2000. Para ampliar y facilitar la consulta del catálogo, cada volumen contiene un índice analítico en el que los instrumentos se agruparon por su aplicación; organización de colecciones, préstamo, almacenamiento, entre otros.

Por último, es recomendable que todo bibliotecario revise publicaciones antiguas sobre la especialidad, pues lo narrado en ellas da un sentido de pertenencia a un gremio comprometido no solo con los servicios bibliotecarios, sino con el acontecer social, económico, educativo y político regional, nacional e internacional. Para concluir, me ha parecido encontrar una mina de oro de información al revisar estos casi 125 años de la revista *Library Journal*.

Air-conditioned exhibit cases protect rare books

Air-conditioned exhibit cases protect rare books

The exhibit cases in the lobby of the Central building at the Free Library of Philadelphia were recently air-conditioned in order to assure the safe exhibition of library materials and especially rare books and manuscripts.

In 1951, subsequent to the redecoration of the Central Library thirty-four custom-built vertical exhibit cases were installed in the main lobby and adjoining corridor. In the short time these exhibit cases have been in use many different kinds of material have been shown and each has presented its own problem of display: books which will not stay open, pages which curl, maps which refuse to lie flat. None however has been more difficult than the problem of rare books on vellum. The Free Library has many of this type in its Rare Book Department which is air-conditioned. Ordinarily rare books are housed and displayed there where the temperature is held at 70 degrees and the humidity at 50 per cent. Their display is always popular in the Rare Book Department and the Library decided soon after the new exhibit cases were installed to show them from time to time in the lobby where traffic is heavy.

Before the first rare material was placed into the cases however the Rare Book librarian placed a page of vellum in the cases to determine the effect of the heat and humidity. Quickly the vellum curled in ridges. With the advice of experts a makeshift solution was devised utilizing water jars and cigar-store humidifiers to increase

the moisture in the air while some of the lights in the cases were extinguished, reducing the temperature. When, after experimentation it was found that the heat was still too high, the heat in the lobby was lowered. After all these measures had been taken the library was able to exhibit some of its treasures with safety, but only under dim lights and in a chilly atmosphere.

The only effective answer was to air-condition the cases and by early 1957 the money was made available and work began. Lighting fixtures in the tops of the cases were moved and holes cut for air ducts, which passed from behind the cases to stack areas on either side of the lobby. In these stack areas as close as possible to the cases, are two air-conditioning units, one for each side.

Although vellum books have been preserved through the centuries, and can stand almost any weather condition, they cannot withstand the dry heat of modern buildings. Thanks to air-conditioned cases the outstanding collections of the Free Library will be preserved for the future.



Loose film quickly piles up and frequently snarls and sometimes results in ruined film. Both wheels are synchronized so that when one wheel stops the other does also. Slack for splicing is obtained simply by turning the reels by hand.

A foot pedal controls both direction and speed of the reels, leaving both hands free for touch inspection or for quick splicing. The reel shafts are inclined slightly so that no locking device is needed to secure the reels and therefore mounting can be done with one hand.






Telephone aid for reference work

A DEVICE that should be of help to librarians who must consult reference texts, encyclopedias, etc., to answer telephone questions is *Fone-Master*. The device consists of a cradle, similar in appearance to a desk telephone cradle, together with a small loudspeaker. If the librarian receiving the call finds it necessary to leave the telephone but still wishes to continue the conversation, he simply lays the telephone receiver into the *Fone-Master* cradle. The unit will then pick up and amplify the incoming voice to the extent determined by the volume control. It will also transmit the librarian's voice, picking it up and feeding it into the telephone. It should be added, however, that this device is not meant for answering telephone questions in a quiet reading area.

Since there is nothing to install, connect or attach, the telephone can always be used in the usual manner. Since *Fone-Master* is not connected to the telephone, the manufacturer says that there is no objection to its use from the telephone company.

It is also useful, according to the manufacturer, in permitting several persons to participate in a telephone conversation at the same time, is helpful to persons with defective hearing, and makes it easier to take dictation or write down material received over the telephone.

Electric hand dryers

Electric hand dryers for library washrooms, particularly those used by the public, have much to recommend them. Their primary value lies in their economy and their help in keeping washrooms neat. Savings occur in several ways. First, there is the saving in paper towels. While individually inexpensive, paper towels when used in quantity, particularly by careless and wasteful patrons, can become a consider-



able item in the budget. There is also the hidden cost of purchasing, storing, and installing the towels and removing the waste paper, small tasks that use up the valuable time of the janitor. Finally, there is the problem of neatness. No matter how many warning signs, towels will be deposited on the floor or even in the plumbing, causing an occasional stoppage.

Electric hand dryers are not without their faults. They break down, and while repairs are not costly, they do require a skilled repairman. They don't dry as rapidly as a good paper towel, but their hot air blast does the job in surprisingly little time.

A well designed and efficient dryer currently in use at the Free Library is the

American Dryer, manufactured by the American Dryer Corporation, 1405 Locust St., Philadelphia 2, Pa. Two models are available: the standard single nozzle unit and the dual nozzle unit which enables two people to dry simultaneously. 
THE MIMEOGRAPH, the work horse duplicating machine of many libraries, has recently received a valuable assist with a new electronic device. Called Gestefax, it is designed to reproduce any given subject, i.e., photographs, office forms, drawings, letters, etc. directly onto a mimeo stencil. The stencil is then ready to reproduce as many copies as are desired. Proofreading is eliminated, because the stencil is an exact copy of the original.

In the past, illustrations on mimeo stencils had to be cut directly on the stencil, a difficult, time-consuming job limited to line drawings, and requiring considerable skill. Now book lists, annual reports, etc., can be illustrated with all types of photographs and half tones (both must have good contrast), drawings, etc. The paste-up technique of preparing layouts can now be done for the mimeo process, a long cherished, but hitherto impossible dream.

Unlike the preparation of illustrations on photo offset masters, this electronic

process uses no camera, no darkroom, no chemicals or trays. The unit fits on a regular office desk and does the job automatically.

The price of Gestefax — \$1995 — is such that only large users will wish to own their own machine. However, most cities have Gestetner Mimeograph dealers (400 in the US) who are usually equipped to make stencils from paste-ups for around \$3.50 each. Stencils can also be made by this process for use on other makes of mimeograph machines. Gestefax is manufactured by the Gestetner Duplicator Corp, 216-222 Lake Ave., Yonkers, New York.

ACCORDING to the filing experts, paper clips should be removed before papers are filed, especially if the papers are going to be kept a long time, such as in archives. The reason is that clips take up valuable space, and, unless they are stainless steel (recently developed, thanks to the Library Technology Project) they are likely to rust and mar the paper. Staples, which are often used for this purpose don't waste space, but they too may rust.

The Paper Welder is an alternate way of fastening sheets together. It has particular value for filing, but it can be used for other paper fastening purposes as well. According to the manufacturer, it will weld up to six sheets of 18#, and in some cases more. The welding is accomplished by pressing the handle of the Paper Welder which causes a set of dies to press the sheets to-

gether creating an interlocking corrugation which holds the paper. The paper can be separated without mutilation by pressing the thumb nail or a smooth object over the corrugations.

Since it costs nothing to press the handle, the manufacturer claims that the Paper Welder will soon pay for itself as there are no metallic fasteners to buy. The price is \$13.95. Manufactured by Paper Welder, Inc., Medina, New York.

Exit lock improves security

Exit lock improves security

ALL LIBRARIES are constantly faced with the serious problem of preventing books and other material from being illegally removed from stacks, offices or other spaces within the building, or from the building itself. Much of this theft occurs because exits, required by fire regulations, are unsupervised. Because the cost of supervising such exits is prohibitive, much of the loss continues.

An effective way of meeting this problem is through the installation of emergency Exit Locks. At the Free Library of Philadelphia an outside exit which accounted for a large amount of unauthorized traffic in the past has been closed by an Exit Lock for the past two years. During this time, only one person has broken the glass and left through this door, the psychological barrier of having to break the glass and ring the bell, has proved an effective deterrent.

The Exit Lock is equipped with a thin glass panel covered by a metal clapper. In case of fire or emergency, the clapper is struck by hand, or, in other models, by pushing a panic bar. This automatically breaks the glass and releases a latch bolt, rings the alarm bell and permits opening of the door. While the door is normally locked in this fashion, it may be opened by authorized persons with a key. The door may be left in an unlocked position for loading, deliveries, etc., and then re-locked. The lock can be used on single and double doors. It is also possible to tie all Exit Locks to the

building into a security indicator board which flashes a light when any door is opened. Locks are approved by Fire Underwriters and most fire and building regulations.

Typewriter correction paper

ANOTHER new method of correcting typewriter mistakes, called *Perfectype*, has been introduced by the Perry-Sherwood Corporation, 255 Park Avenue South, New York 10, N. Y. *Perfectype* consists of specially treated strips of paper. To correct a mistake, the typist back-spaces to the mistake, inserts one of the strips between the ribbon and the mistake, then types the same letter again. The special coating on the *Perfectype* strip is transferred to the paper only where the key strikes, "whiting out" the error.

Our test — three of our stenographers tried it — gave on the whole favorable results. One of the typists was enthusiastic, another favorable, the third unfavorable. The difference in opinion seems to turn primarily on typing habits; the kind of paper used and the character struck in error are contributing factors. The manufacturer will furnish free samples of the product so that libraries can determine its value in specific library applications.

One advantage which is not open to much question is that typewriter maintenance is reduced because use of the correction paper eliminates eraser debris. An envelope containing 308 square inches of perforated tabs, enough to correct more than 3,000 mistakes, sells for \$1.98.

TWO RECENT INNOVATIONS in map or plan files are the Plan Hold vertical and roll files. These files have been developed to make maps and plans more accessible than when they are piled horizontally. It is claimed that the vertical filing system saves space since up to 1,200 sheets can be filed in 24 lineal inches. In both filing systems there is no need to punch holes or mutilate sheets, and in the vertical system there is no wrinkle problem since the sheets hang flat.

In the vertical file a friction binder clamps the edge of from one to 100 sheets, without mutilation. Maps are identified by a plastic window at the end of the binder. To consult the maps, the binder is taken out of the cabinet and the specific map consulted without removing from the binder; or, if desired, the binder can be snapped open removing the maps. The Plan Hold filing cabinet shown comes in two sizes, 34" wide x 36" deep x 52" high for sheets up to 30" x 48" or in the larger size 34" wide x 48" deep x 64" high for sheets up to 42" x 60". Prices range from about \$125 to \$175, depending upon size, number of binders, quantities, etc. Doors have cylinder locks. Each cabinet holds 20 binders for 2,000 maps. Also available are wall racks which support binders hung from a wall, and mobile racks.

Roll files are designed to accommodate rolls of maps or plans. The small tubes have an inside diameter of 2 3/4", while the larger tubes are 4 3/8" across. Spring latched doors may be purchased separately (right of illustration), and may be attached to roll file housing without tools. Tube lengths come in 6-inch increments from 23 1/2" to 59 1/2", accommodating material from 24" to 60" wide. Thus the filed material projects one-half inch for easy removal. Doors are designed to cover this projection. Tube ends are reinforced with an aluminum ring which also serves to hold the tube firmly in the housing. Tube length reduction units are furnished with each unit. Of pressboard, cut to the proper length, they are inserted in the end of tubes to prevent shorter maps from becoming lost in the tube.



Shown in the illustration are the small tube unit (four tubes) and the large tube unit, together with separate base and top. All units can be stacked on top of each other or clipped together laterally to form a single, rigid bank of files. Price of four small tubes runs from about \$6 to \$8 per unit, depending upon size. Larger units run from about \$12 to \$19. Quantity discounts. All units are steel, finished in baked enamel. PARTICULARLY APPROPRIATE for medium size libraries with coffee-loving staffs of 20 or more is this new coin-operated coffee percolator. Unlike conventional coffee vending machines, this one is under the control of the library, and can be bought outright or by installments. The coffee is made by library personnel, which may — or may not — assure its quality; but if properly prepared, this percolator produces good coffee, as your editor can testify. The coffee is brewed fresh daily and real, not instant, coffee is used. Coffee, plastic cups, individual packets of creamers, sugar and stirrers are all sold by the distributor, but can be obtained from other sources if desired.

The machine assures that each cup of coffee is paid for by a coin mechanism that dispenses one paper cup and allows seven

ounces of coffee to be drawn for 10 cents deposited in the machine. If the volume is at least 25 cups a day, there will be enough revenue to pay for the coffee and the machine.

The unit is all metal and has a locked storage compartment. Colors are beige and gold. A meter counts coins and cups, and the machine has a timer which starts the percolator in the morning so that fresh coffee is ready when the library opens. No water connection or drain is required; unit operates on a 115 volt AC wall outlet.


The percolator makes up to 60 seven-ounce cups, two ounces larger than the standard restaurant cup, and can be refilled as often during the day as desired. The unit, which costs \$390, can be purchased outright or by a 20 percent down payment and payments of \$15 a month for 24 months; or no down payment and \$15 a month for 30 months. Lettering Machine

A LETTERING MACHINE which makes it possible for an amateur to produce a wide variety of professionally drawn letters is the Varigraph. The unit should prove useful in the production of posters, signs, and silk screen, multilith and printing layouts for reading lists, title pages, or other library printing. A precision machine, it will be most useful for libraries which have a considerable amount of such work. The Varigraph is designed to draw letters in the 4 to 72 point range and a wide variety of type styles are available, including such faces as gothic, roman, script, and novelty.

After determining the location for the lettering, the Varigraph is placed over the area to be lettered, resting on a straight edge which is used to guide the machine across the drawing board. An alphabet template is placed under the unit. Two dials on the face of the machine are set for the height and width of the letters desired. Using the stylus in the lower right-hand corner of the machine, the letters in the template are traced. The pen attached to the top of the unit then outlines the letters in the size and width previously determined.



Since the work is in full view of the operator, spelling and spacing errors are minimized. About 600 variations in height, width, slant (forward or backward) of a single type style are possible (italic model required for slanting). The outline letters can be filled in as required by ink, paint, or benday patterns. Where creative lettering is required, effects such as curved, shadow, perspective, reversed, and overlapping lettering can be executed.

The instrument is 7" x 7" x 1 3/8" and weighs 1 1/2 lbs. There are several models in various price ranges; the italic model, which can convert all alphabets to italics, is priced at \$159.50. IN THIS ERA of automatic sorting equipment, hand-sorted punched cards still have considerable value for libraries. In fact, because most libraries are not large, their data sorting problems are particularly well handled by a manually operated, relatively simple sorting system like *McBee*. Marginally punched cards are useful because they make it possible to identify various numbers (or characteristics which have been reduced to numerical symbols) by a simple sorting process. The numbers which are to be identified are notched out from specific holes in the card by a special notching punch, so that when the sorting rod (resembling a blunt ice pick) is pushed through a hole, the cards in which the hole has been notched slide down and separate from the deck.

Research projects, book ordering, and personnel analysis are three areas of library operation in which marginal punched cards are especially useful. Numerically coded responses to questionnaires completed by library users could be punched on *Keysort* cards and various "sorts" made to determine number, education, or residence of readers. In the preparation of consolidated book or periodical orders for libraries in county or metropolitan systems, titles and number of copies wanted for each library could be coded on cards, thus reducing an almost unmanageable mass of statistical data to easily used proportions. In personnel work, by notching out significant information such as specialized book knowledge, fields of academic study, foreign languages, special abilities, etc., for all or specific employees, it is possible for the library personnel officer to quickly locate individuals for tasks as needed.

One of the most valuable uses of *McBee* cards is their use as transaction cards in circulation control. In this application they are used as permanent transaction cards in a photo-charging system. This type of system employs a microfilm camera to take a picture of the borrower's registration card, the book card, and the transaction card. The transaction cards are serially numbered *McBee* cards which bear the due date. One transaction card is photographed for each book that is being borrowed. After being photographed, the card is placed in the book pocket (along with the book card). In this way the *McBee* cards provide a numerical sequence covering all books borrowed

during a given period of time, usually one day. When books are returned, the *McBee* transaction cards are removed from the books and, using *Keysort* sorting equipment, are placed in numerical sequence again. About a week or so following the due date, the transaction cards are checked. Those cards which are missing represent books that have not been returned. Since the missing transaction cards were photographed with the book card and the borrower's card when originally charged out, the next step is to run the microfilm through a viewer to find out the titles of the missing books and the names and addresses of the borrowers.

The operation which takes the most time in the above sequence is putting the transaction cards in numbered sequence so that missing cards can be located. In a library with a large circulation this may be done at a central location by means of automatic



sorting equipment. A centralized installation, however, has the disadvantage that it requires the transaction cards to be sent in daily from the various libraries to the centralized sorting section. Several years ago the Free Library of Philadelphia changed from a centralized sorting system using automatic sorting equipment to a decentralized system using *McBee* cards manually sorted in the branches. This work is carried on by clerical personnel, and has proved to be as efficient as the centralized system while being less expensive and providing an excellent filler for unused charging desk time. A daily list of missing numbers is forwarded to the Central Circulation Department in the Central Library to be checked against the microfilm photos which were taken when the books were charged out. Overdue notices are then sent out from the Central Circulation Department.

The cost of a *McBee* installation depends upon its size and complexity. Small cards which accommodate a limited amount of data are less costly than larger ones. Some applications require specialized cards while others can use standard cards at a considerable savings. *Royal-McBee* representatives are available in principal cities and are willing to discuss sorting problems at no charge. Transparency Maker

A PORTABLE UNIT called the 3M Brand Transparency Maker Model 70, capable of making 8" x 10" transparencies or bond weight black on white copy from virtually any document of any color in any place, has just been announced.

As the illustration shows, first, the carrying case which also doubles as the exposure unit is lifted from the base which serves as the developer unit (top left), then the original and an intermediate sheet are placed beneath a glass plate which is contained in a compartment in the base. The exposure unit is fitted over the plate (top right), and original and intermediate are exposed to light for several seconds. Next, the intermediate and a sheet of transparency film or copy paper are placed together in the developer unit (lower left). After a few seconds the image forms. The operator can check it visually to see when it has reached the proper stage of development (lower right), stopping the process when he is satisfied.

The company claims that there are almost no moving parts involved, and no chemicals or solutions are necessary. For use at any location where 120 volt current is available, it is claimed that it is simple to operate. The unit measures 12½" long by 9½" wide by 10" high and weighs 16 pounds. 

Mirrors and TV for Security

THEFT AND MUTILATION of books are among the most pressing of library problems today. Two relatively new approaches to the problem are the use of mirrors and closed circuit television. As with most security equipment, the contribution of these devices is less in the actual catching of thieves and vandals than in serving as a deterrent and a reminder to readers that, while in the library, they are under constant observation. As experience and several studies have indicated, if patrons are constantly made aware of the library's interest in protecting its collection, theft and mutilation of books will be reduced.

Detector Mirrors

Widely used in stores and supermarkets, detector mirrors are particularly useful in libraries in monitoring blind spots such as the space between shelf ranges, alcoves, and window bays. Mirrors are obvious; they advertise their existence and make patrons aware of the library's concern. They save




staff time and steps, and also have a limited safety value in helping to prevent accidents in blind aisles and traffic areas.

Mirrors are available in a variety of shapes and sizes, but two of the most widely used are the circular convex and the rectangular contour. The circular convex — the kind found in supermarkets — comes in seven diameters ranging from 6" to 36". Prices range from \$10 to \$50. Units weigh from 12 to 30 lbs. and are available with a friction ball joint. On larger sizes, ratchet swivels make it possible to orient the mirror in any direction. The rectangular contour shape mirror can be used with low ceilings where space is limited. Rectangular mirrors come in several sizes ranging from 9" x 17" to 20" x 36", and cost from \$20 to \$55. Mirrors manufactured by the Long Island Plate Glass and Mirror Co. (63-17 Metropolitan Avenue, Middle Village, New York) are protected by a shock absorbing vinyl channel mounted in 24-gauge steel, backed up with a protecting metal lip. Each unit comes with a kit ready for mounting on walls, ceilings, or other support.

Closed Circuit Television

Closed circuit television is a recent contribution from the family of electronic detection devices being adapted for library use. A television camera makes possible constant viewing of a reading area or exit, and if monitored by a staff member should provide an effective way of detecting illegal activity. Constant monitoring, however, is monotonous and costly in staff time unless combined with another activity. A better method is periodic observation plus advertisement of the fact that the room or exit is under TV control. A TV receiver placed near an entrance, where the reader can see himself on the screen as he goes by, is an effective reminder. A small TV camera (measuring 6" high x 14" long x 3" wide and weighing only 8 lbs.) can easily be concealed.

According to the manufacturer, the system's size (the monitor is 16" square with an 11" screen, and weighs 30 lbs.) permits placement of the unit in different locations in the library as the security situation requires. The unit can also be used for remote viewing of library events, with overflow crowds being accommodated in a different location from the main event.



Any number of receiving sets can be used with one camera, making monitoring possible at several points throughout the library. An existing TV receiving set can, it is claimed, be easily adapted for this purpose.

Wide angle lens, which cover more of the room, and telephoto lens, which make possible better observation of distant events, are available as accessories at extra cost. Remote control zoom lens which make close-ups possible, will be available in the near future. Also operated by remote control and now sold as accessories, are pan and tilt controls.

The Filmdex Corp., distributors of Regiscope Charging Cameras, handle the Filmdex Closed Circuit TV. The system is fully transistorized (except for the vidicon and picture tubes) and is designed for continuous operation. Guarantees are provided, as are servicing arrangements. The system consists of one 11" monitor, equipped for VHF and UHF reception, one camera (25mm with f 1.9 lens), 100 feet of coaxial cable and normal installation. Price for this basic unit is \$699. Computer produced book catalog

Computer Produced Book Catalog

THE FIRST commercially produced, fully computerized book catalogs, adapted to meet the requirements of individual library systems, are now available from Documentation Incorporated, Bethesda, Maryland. The initial set of computer produced catalogs is now in use in the Baltimore County, Maryland, Public Library, a system of 17 libraries serving a population of 550,000 residents of suburban Baltimore.

Producing the Catalog

The library shelflist cards are used as input. Each unique data element for a particular title is coded and keypunched onto IBM cards. Each title is keyed only once. The data is then transferred onto magnetic tape in machine-readable form. The computer generates all catalog entries for each section of the divided catalog — Title, Subject, and Author — and puts the catalog pages in the required format. The catalog pages are then printed on a high speed computer printer using a specially designed, 120 char-

acter, upper/lower case print chain. In their "camera ready" form, the pages consist of two columns, each containing 85 lines of data. The pages are then photo-reduced, printed, and bound into catalog volumes.

Doc. Inc. is currently offering this service based on the use of standardized Library of Congress cataloging which, according to the company, results in substantial cost savings to libraries. Since a single magnetic tape record can be used an infinite number of times, libraries can share the standardized Library of Congress titles. Catalog entries can be tailored to the requirements of individual libraries by giving as full or brief an entry as desired. For example, the Author citation may contain the full Library of Congress entry while giving more abbreviated entries in the Title and Subject catalogs. Entries can also be modified to show the library's own shelf number, and symbols can be added to indicate the holdings of branch libraries.

Documentation, Inc. points out the usual advantages of the book catalog for librarians: portability, saving in staff time, easier use, savings in money.

Advantages of Computer Book Catalogs

While there are several methods of producing book catalogs, Doc. Inc. claims that the electronic computer process has the most advantages, as follows:

1) Greater flexibility: The page layout and/or catalog entry format can be revised more easily and quickly. LC cataloging data can be printed in full, or in short form, or in both formats in different parts of the catalog. Classification conversion — from LC to Dewey, for example — can be greatly simplified by letting the computer handle much of the routine detail involved in looking up proper numbers, producing labels, etc. Children's, historical, and other special collections can be listed in a separate catalog and in the main catalog, yet the cataloging need only be "keyboarded" once. Changes and improvements can be made to a computer system without affecting the cataloging information on file.

2) Computers are accurate and consistent: Misfiling is eliminated. The computer can be programmed to detect major errors and return them for correction. Once entered into the computer system, data may be filed, refiled, rearranged, or otherwise manipulated without affecting accuracy.

3) Computers can aid in editing, review-

ing, and correcting data: The computer has a supervised editing program — only unacceptable entries require human editing. The computer may be programmed to adjust minor cataloging inconsistencies. For example, "U.S." may be filed as spelled, "United States."

4) Computers can provide attractive type faces, readable formats: Computers now offer upper- and lower-case type faces. Entry headings can be in upper case for emphasis, although the cataloging data is "keyboarded" only once in both upper- and lower-case.

5) Computers are more economical: They can process a higher volume of information faster than any other method, with a resulting lower cost. As a result, supplements and annual sets are cumulated less expensively by a computer than by other methods. Because each character on a catalog card is "keyboarded" only once to put it on the computer file, keyboarding for a computer is the least expensive method of data input.



Telephone Emergency Alarm

The cost of leased telephone wires has deterred many libraries from installing burglar or fire alarms. Now available is an electronic alarm system that makes use of ordinary telephone facilities rather than leased wires connected to private protection companies, the police or fire departments, or a central security unit.

The new Tel-Guard unit consists of a cradle-like stand for a telephone (generally placed in an inconspicuous, out-of-the-way location), and a number of sensing devices which, in case of emergency, trigger the system. When the system is activated, the telephone receiver lifts automatically and a mechanical arm dials "0" for the operator. A prerecorded tape reports the necessary information in a calm, professional voice, repeating the message continuously for three minutes so there can be no errors concerning the location or nature of the emergency. By means of two tapes, the system can report either fire or burglary, depending upon the sensing device which has been activated.

The system works with many different kinds of sensing devices. Door switches, foot mats, and electric eyes can be installed to detect break-ins or tampering. Other sensing devices can be installed to detect fire, smoke, fumes, changes in temperature and water. The system is also useful in detecting utility failures, gas accumulation, or refrigeration breakdowns.





Book Theft Control

An electronic detection system designed to minimize the theft of books has recently been introduced by Metal Edge Industries. The system has been experimentally installed at the Frankford Branch of the Free Library of Philadelphia and, on the basis of results to date, has been characterized by the library's director, Emerson Greenaway, as "... less expensive and more efficient per book protected than any other system we have examined."

The Checkpoint system works as follows: first, electronically sensitive card stock is concealed in books in the library. (Tests show that unskilled clerical workers can treat an average of four books a minute.) The card stock can be in the form of book plates, card pockets, or blank reinforcing pieces. Once installed, books are permanently protected. Electronic sensing equipment and screens are then installed. They are tamperproof and automatic. The screens are custom-made to blend with the decor of the library. The control equipment requires 15" of single shelf space and is hidden by the loan desk.

When a reader charges out a book properly, nothing happens. However, if someone tries to remove a book illegally, the sensitive material in the book activates the system, an alarm

sounds, and a turnstile or door is automatically locked. The system works even if the book is concealed.

When the alarm goes off, the desk attendant can tactfully treat the incident as an accident and offer to charge out the book. This approach eliminates the need for an embarrassing confrontation or personal search.

Signs throughout the library call attention to the electronic security system and act as an effective deterrent to the removal of books.

Reading device for the blind

Optacon is an electronic device that converts printed images into readable, vibrating representations that can be felt and read by blind persons. It provides access not only to books and magazines, but also to correspondence, memos, labels, directories, charts, cathode ray tubes, and other sources of information normally closed to the blind.

To use the *Optacon*, the miniature camera (about the size of a pocket knife) is held in the hand and moved along a line of print. The camera contains two tiny lamps plus phototransistors that register the intensity of light and produce signals which are converted into a pattern of vibrating reeds. If the camera is held over the letter "o," the reeds respond by forming a pattern like a crater with a vibrating rim; other letters produce tactile patterns corresponding to their shapes.

The reeds produce an image on a "tactile screen" which is about 1" x 1/2". A blind person can feel the entire array with one finger. The unit is about 2" x 6" x 8", weighs four pounds, is battery operated, and comes in a leather carrying case with adjustable shoulder strap.

Controls adjust 1) the magnification of the image to compensate for type sizes, and 2) the intensity of the vibrating reeds; and 3) determine what light intensity will cause the reeds to vibrate, compensating for differences in reflectivity of inks and papers. The circuitry can be changed by switch so that white letters can be read on a black background or on a luminous display such as on electronic calculators.

A small computer, it is programmed with interchangeable language modules which can be quickly replaced. Each module translates English into a second language and vice versa. This would give the patron an opportunity to respond by choosing, for example, between glass, ceramic, metal, or other material.



DATA TERMINAL

By interacting with the computer, patrons can get information about which they might not have thought to ask. For example, a staff member at the desk may answer only one facet of the question; the computer, on the other hand, could provide such additional information on the bottle question as the availability of periodical, pamphlet, or other resources; the names of other libraries with different holdings; etc. With proper programming the computer can provide printed information which patrons can tear out and take with them. Further, a slide projector can be hooked up to the computer which can provide a photograph of a particular reference resource, such as a copy of the *Guide to Periodical Literature*.

In addition to patron service, the TST 180, together with its microprocessor and memory, is useful in recording statistics of patron interest. Since each touch is automatically recorded, it is easy to develop the collection around areas of reader concern. 



A compact instant photographic system for producing 3¼" x 4¼" color and black and white prints and black and white negatives from mounted 35mm slides has been developed by Polaroid. Called the Polaprinter, it is useful for reference print production for special libraries in such fields as medicine, graphic and fine arts, etc. As an in-house copying tool, it eliminates the possible losses and time delays of outside copying, while offering slide libraries an effective method of cataloging and producing copies of 35mm slides without darkroom facilities.

To make a print, the user simply frames the slide on an illuminated preview panel equipped with a moving selector for cropping, inserts the slide into the Polaprinter, presses a button, and pulls out the exposed film packet. The slide is exposed automatically with exact, even illumination from a flash tube equipped with a specially designed rectangular reflector. Two filtered, silicon photodiodes measure the light passing through the slide to time flash duration. Polaroid Type 669 Land Film is used for color prints; a black and white positive print and negative are simultaneously produced in 30 seconds.

The portable copier is equipped with an optical contrast control system and automatic electronic exposure control. Manual controls can adjust exposure for precise density corrections or modify print contrast. A three-element copy lens fitted with a fixed elliptical aperture and mounted with a solenoid-activated electronic shutter focuses the image without manual adjustments.

Pulling a film packet from the electronically monitored pack film holder built into the base of the Polaprinter activates a built-in timer which automatically signals with LED indicators and audio beeps when prints are developed. Three print processing cycles can be

timed simultaneously for rapid multiple copying. An exposure can be made every 20 seconds.

The George Washington University, located in the District of Columbia, admits 16,000 students (64% of them pursuing graduate degrees) to programs in liberal arts and sciences, government and business administration, international relations, education, engineering, law, and medicine.

Its main library — named after topographer Melvin Gelman — is centrally situated on campus and easily accessible to all students. The Gelman Library is also just six blocks from the White House, so it serves as a scholarly "main branch" for thousands of federal employees and business people who work in the District. Recently, the combined patronage of town and gown has accelerated the normal pace of deterioration of paper periodicals, resulting in a well-worn collection.

"Our periodicals were falling apart before we could get them to the library," notes Connie Kearns (McCarthy), former Assistant University Librarian for Collections, now at Duke University. "Those that did make it to the library were inaccessible to our researchers with urgent information needs."

The solution to Gelman's access and deterioration problems? The purchase of 400 periodicals in microform, to supplement and/or replace the paper copies.

"We made the decision to commit to microforms in conjunction with our plans to consolidate the periodicals collection," says Patricia Kelley, Assistant University Librarian for Programs and Services. The library recently converted the third floor into a one-stop periodicals reading and research area. Prime space was set aside to house the microforms and an enhanced complement of reader-printers, in a reading room designed by UMI's space planning specialist. UMI also trained subject specialists in the effective use of microforms in manage and develop the periodicals collection.

"UMI supplied us with the titles we needed to maintain our standing as a respected research institution. Staff training and reading room design — provided at no extra cost to the University — just reinforced our decision to work with them," says Ms. Kelley.
